PSHE is an important part of the curriculum because it has an impact on all aspects of a student's social, psychological, and mental health. All students are entitled to appropriate designed elements as outlined in the overall school framework, which is intended to support their personal and social development. It equips children with the knowledge, skills, and understanding they need to live confident, healthy, independent lives and to become informed, active, and responsible citizens in an ever-changing world. As a result, we aid in the development of their sense of self-worth.

PSHE is scheduled weekly and taught according to the timetable in each class. It is also taught through cross-curricular opportunities.

The school continues to adhere to and evaluate its practices in accordance with the five outcomes: Be Healthy, Stay Safe, Enjoy and Achieve, make a Positive Contribution, and Achieve mental, social, physical, and economic well-being.

Promoting Health at School

The school is dedicated to creating a "Health Promoting School"/ "Healthy School" climate and culture that promotes the health and well-being of students and the entire school community, and fully recognizes the importance of coordinating well-being with learning. This means that we consider teaching and learning in the context of our overall strategy for:

- Encourage parents and guardians to work together to support children's learning and development in PSHE, health, and well-being.
- Encourage children to participate in the review and development of work related to PSHE and Healthy Schools.
- Make it possible to assess children's learning in accordance with local and national guidelines.
- With the help of the PSHE Service, continue to develop policy and practice in the area of Healthy Schools.
- Provide guidelines for selecting and utilizing high-quality resources.
- Provide guidance to help ensure the quality of PSHE teaching and learning methodology and approaches.
- Support the PSHE coordinator in observing, evaluating, and improving practices.
- Establish e-safety policies and procedures to assist students and staff in reducing risk and responding to complaints.
- Ascertain that all teachers are equipped to teach students about e-safety.
- Advise on how to use social media and live streaming
- Ascertain that all students have the necessary skills for an online life.
- Guide students and make them understand.
 - How to stay safe and healthy online while also becoming active citizens who
 participate responsibly in society.
 - How to spot potential online threats and make well-informed decisions about what to do next.
 - Safe avenues for seeking help if they are concerned or upset by something they have seen on the internet
 - o Recognize what is acceptable and unacceptable online behavior.
 - o Recognize the techniques commonly used to persuade or manipulate others
- Develop their identity and self-esteem as active, confident members of their online community.

Support and training will be made available to all staff as part of the School Development Plan. This includes devoting time at staff meetings to introduce new areas of work and assess the efficacy of existing approaches. When the entire staff requires development, a whole staff inset is used.
